• Robert Bellinger has a BA in Psychology and Black Studies from Amherst College, an Ed.M. from Photo: Suffolk University Harvard Graduate School of Education, and a Ph.D. in history from Boston College. As an educator, he has taught at the pre-school, elementary school, middle-school, high-school, and university levels. After a teaching career of almost half a century. Dr. Bellinger is now an independent public historian. Using history as a foundation and recognizing that people and their cultures do not exist in isolation necessitates an approach that is interdisciplinary, cross-cultural, and comparative.

"End The Fossil Fuel Addiction that Feeds Putin and Biden's War Machine" with Svitlana Romanko

The United States was the biggest investor in Russian carbon bomb fossil fuel projects as of 2022, with 154 financial institutions holding 23.64 billion U.S. dollars in investments. Fossil fuel addiction drives the Russian war in Ukraine. How do we resist and rebuild Ukraine on a clean energy of peace?

• Svitlana Romanko holds a doctorate in Environmental Law, Climate Change Law, Climate Governance, and Climate Policy. Romanko is a founder and director of Razom We Stand. She is a prominent Ukrainian campaigner, movement strategist, and climate activist, who launched and coordinated the Stand With Ukraine campaign to ban all imports of fossil fuels from Russia, end the war in Ukraine, and hasten a clean energy transition across the globe. Previously, she worked for 350.org, Green Deal projects in Eastern Europe and for the Laudato Si Movement.

A first-prize laureate in the Sphinx Competition and top honor recipient at the Lipinski-Wieniaswski and Henryk Szeryng International competitions, Gavilán is a founding member of the Harlem String Quartet.



"Ray McGovern on Russia & Ukraine"

Ray McGovern, formerly an Army intelligence and infantry officer, went on to serve at the CIA for 27 years. During this time his duties included chairing the National Intelligence Estimates and preparing the President's Daily Brief which he briefed to President Reagan's most senior national security advisors. In 2003, Ray co-created Veteran Intelligence Professionals for Sanity (VIPS) to expose how intelligence was being falsified to "justify" war on Irag.

At his retirement, the CIA awarded Ray McGovern with the Intelligence Commendation Medallion for "especially meritorious service." In 2006, Ray returned the medal explaining "I do not want to be associated, however remotely, with an agency engaged in torture."



"A Life In Three Acts: Peace, Porn and Prayer"




as you despise their ideas, never forget there are real people behind every principle and never, ever give up.
